The Institute for Aspiring Principals is designed to help prepare selected future principals to become leaders who can work toward increasing student achievement for all students. Participants will be involved in a course of study that will include both large and small group sessions, guest speakers, and self-assessments designed to strengthen leadership skills.

Participants will study many areas of leadership, including:

- issues and research on leadership characteristics and behaviors that have an impact on student achievement;
- leading effective change and managing conflict;
- effective school organization and climates conducive to achievement for all students;
- issues and strategies of race, ethnicity, limited English proficiency, and poverty that impact student learning;
- community involvement
- use of various types of data to complete a school profile and identify areas of strength and areas to be improved.

Participants in the Aspiring Principals Institute will

- Be able to bring back to their schools data, research, and ideas that they have learned and/or developed in the Institute.
- Apply research-based leadership strategies for improving student achievement in their own schools
- Analyze schools for organizational and cultural effectiveness
- Develop a Personal Profile from inventories/instruments that identifies strengths and areas for improvement and outline a Professional Learning Plan
- Collect and analyze various types of school data to work with faculty to determine which students are not learning and why
- Learn how to develop a School Improvement Plan and determine school priorities
- Learn about district and state policies and plans
